The Mushroom projector is designed to make it easy to change the lighting mood inside the home. The result of a collaboration between lighting designer Stefano Dall'Osso and the B Light company of Friuli, Italy, the Mushroom is available in two versions: a track version and a wall and ceiling-mounted version. The track version is particularly flexible and able to focus light on any aspect of the interior space as required. It comes in three sizes, has a circular shape and is made of aluminium. The projector is dimmable and has a low tension power supply.
